

Michael-John Hurney has become one of the most respected and sought after professionals on the world stage. Michael-John's career highlights include the role of Pontius Pilate in a London production of Jesus Christ Superstar, the role of Jean Valjean in Les Miserables in Concert with the Twilite Symphony Orchestra in Jakarta, singing the Australian National Anthem for the World Cup Rugby League Final, and performing for celebrity super couple Posh & Becks at their 'Beckingham Palace' home in England.

Professional theatre credits include Hair (Australia), Oklahoma (Australia), Jesus Christ Superstar (London, Denmark, Sweden, Hong Kong, Singapore, Australia), The Pirates of Penzance (Australia), La Cage Aux Folles (Australia), Guys and Dolls (Australia), H.M.S. Pinafore (Sydney), Danny La Rue Show (Australia), Bad Boy Johnny & The Prophets of Doom (Melbourne), The Rocky Horror Show (Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong), Rasputin (Sydney), The Baker's Wife (NIDA), Alan Seymour's play 'The One Day of the Year' (London), Lend me a Tenor (Australia), and played Gus/Growltiger in the World Tour of the Andrew Lloyd Webber musical Cats for which he was nominated for a prestigious Green Room Award.

Michael-John sang for the Sydney 2000 Olympics bid at The Sydney Opera House, at the Kostya Tzyu World Title Fight at the Sydney Entertainment Centre, and has performed at the nationally televised Anzac Day Dawn Service on the Seven Network.

His voice features on many TV Commercials and Soundtrack Albums such as Moulin Rouge, the Jon English Rock Opera -Paris, La Cage Aux Folles – Australian Cast Album, Oklahoma – Australian Cast Album, A Superstar Xmas, and his own Meatballs 'Live' C.D. He has also sung for members of the English Royal Family, Australian Governor Generals, Prime Ministers, and even sang on British Airways Concorde.

Michael-John produced and starred in his own hugely successful stage shows Meatballs - Fat out of Hell, and Luciano Pavlova 'The World's Biggest Comic Opera Star'. He is also a creative force behind the world's most successful corporate impostors 'The Three Waiters'.
